

President's Message

I want to know what happened to September. Time sure does fly even during these COVID times. It will be Thanksgiving and Christmas before we know it. And in that light at the last council meeting on September 14, they approved having the living Nativity on Saturday, December 18th. The bell and chancel choirs are back to practicing on Wednesday evening and performing in Church on Sunday. However, our Sunday services continue with a few limitations as we continue to deal with the COVID safety protocols. Slowly but surely we are starting to get back to normal with our daily living and church events.

The preschool is also getting back to normal. They have 46 children, plus 2 more are anticipated in the next month, which is great. But the 46 are not all full time which means the preschool is not quite back to operating in the black. The forecast though is that as all our daily lives get back to normal this will change and they will be back in the black. The council approved the preschool board members which includes: Janice Bosecke, Nelly Walker, Barbara Hunter (past members), plus three new members; Melissa Pool, Sarah Dunn, and Heather Wilkens. Jennifer Gates, the preschool director, Pastor Jennifer, and Christine Garcia (council liaison) are ex-officio members of the board.

The council approved the churches disassociation with Lutheran High School. This came up when Lutheran High sent the church a bill for \$1200 to continue this association. As OSLC does not have any church members with children at Lutheran High, it was determined that this was not a necessary bill.

If you have been in church the past couple of weeks you see the new IT equipment (two cameras, a computer and screen and wiring which have been installed). This equipment was used to stream the church services on the 12th and 19th of September. The audio on it was much better than has been with the cell phone. There were a couple of glitches though, but these will go away as we get used to using the equipment. There is a learning curve with using this equipment. Those of you watching keep it up and if you note problems, let myself or the church office know. Just as a reminder the service is on the church's YouTube channel, "bit.ly/oursaviourslutheran". As an update concerning the new IT equipment, contributions for the new IT equipment, which is estimated to cost \$14,000, has been \$6,430.53. Adding that to the \$5,000 we received from the Pacifica Synod for IT equipment makes it \$11,430.53 we have, so only \$2,569.47 to go. Thank you to all that have made those contributions!

Your church property committee has been busy replacing light bulbs, one parking lot light bulb along with a spotlight in the church. Also a plumbing repair in the men's restroom was required due to a leaky faucet. Just like our homes there always seems some repair needed. In the next month we will have the trees trimmed in the preschool play yard and the big tree in front of Moreland Hall. Hope you all have a Happy All Saints Day on the 31st. and see you in church.




