# Blessing for a Home at Epiphany

Matthew writes that when the magi saw the shining star stop overhead, they were filled with joy. "On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother" (Matt. 2:10-11). In the home, Christ is met in family and friends, in visitors and strangers. In the home, faith is shared, nurtured, and put into action. In the home, Christ is welcome.

Twelfth Night (January 5), Epiphany of Our Lord (January 6), or another day during the time after Epiphany offers an occasion for gathering with friends and family members for a blessing for the home. Someone may lead the greeting and blessing, while another person may read the scripture passage. Following an eastern European tradition, a visual blessing may be inscribed with white chalk above the main door; for example, 20 + CMB + 21. The numbers change with each new year. The three letters stand for either the ancient Latin blessing Christe mansionem benedicat, which means "Christ, bless this house," or the legendary names of the magi (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar).

#### Greeting

May peace be to this house and to all who enter here. By wisdom a house is built and through understanding it is established; through knowledge its rooms are filled with rare and beautiful treasures. (*Proverbs 24:3-4*)

#### Reading

As we prepare to ask God's blessing on this household, let us listen to the words of scripture.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being, and the life was the light of all people. The Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. (John 1:1-4, 14, 16)

#### Inscription

This inscription may be made with chalk above the entrance:

20 + C M B + 21

Write the appropriate character (left) while speaking the text (right).

C Caspar,

M Melchior, and

B Balthasar,

followed the star of God's Son who came to dwell among us



# **Prayer of Blessing**

O God, you revealed your Son to all people by the shining light of a star. We pray that you bless this home and all who live here with your gracious presence. May your love be our inspiration, your wisdom our guide, your truth our light, and your peace our benediction; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

Then everyone may walk from room to room, blessing the house with incense or by sprinkling with water, perhaps using a branch from the Christmas tree. An acclamation may be sung during the procession, such as Music Sourcebook for All Saints through Transfiguration #S560.

## Report from the President

Can you believe it is 2021? Where does the time go? Hope you all had a Merry Christmas in spite of the COVID stuff. I am very hopeful that with the vaccinations beginning to be distributed that we will be back together sooner rather than later.

Hope you all were able to watch our Christmas Eve service on either Facebook (Our Saviour's Lutheran Church-Orange), or the church website (www.orangeoslc.org), or on our YouTube channel (bit.ly/oursaviourslutheran). There was lots of great music, a children's message, and of course the message that Jesus who was born for us is always, always there for us.

I participated in the OSCC preschool board monthly meeting on December 14. In addition to me, Bob Hunter was also there as was the preschool board (Jennifer Gates, Betty Dierking, Nelly Walker, Kathleen Berg, Melissa Pool, Janice Bosecke, Barbara Hunter and Pastor Jennifer). The preschool has been operating in the red since they opened after closing for the pandemic. This is because the number of children in the school is about half of what it was before closing for the pandemic when they were doing well and making expenses. This up until now has not been a problem because the church received the PPP loan for just over \$81,000 and the preschool was given about \$61,000 of the \$81,000. Well, the PPP loan is now depleted. Plus, now the COVID stuff has kicked back in at full force which has resulted in the school loosing three students (less tuition). With that the school is now losing approximately \$10,000 per month. If that continues, they will probably have to close their doors in the next three months.

To decrease expenses, Jennifer Gates, OSCC director, has laid off one of the teachers. During the month of December, the school is closed between Christmas and New Year's day so there are less expenses. But that is only a short stopgap. When they fully open again in January their expenses (payroll, etc.) will then again exceed their tuition income by something less than \$10k per month. (Jennifer did share that she is anticipating three new students starting in January. If that occurs that \$10k will be reduced.)

To help out the school until they can get their enrollment back up to cover costs, Bob has looked at the church budget to see how the church can help. Currently the preschool gives the church around \$2,000 per month. This is for their portion of the utilities, liability insurance, workman's comp, etc. Bob proposed that the church suspend that for the next several months, maybe up until June/July, when hopefully the COVID-19 vaccinations will be out, life is back to normal and the preschool enrollment is up to cover costs. Also, Bob proposed that the \$4,000 gift from Pastor's friend (which was given to be used for the mission of the church and not normal operating expenses) be set aside and available for the preschool if needed.

The preschool is a mission of the church. To ensure that it continues, the church needs to help. So, the congregational council voted unanimously to authorize the financial help proposed.

Part I of the annual congregational meeting was held on Saturday, December 19, at 11:30AM. Over 36 people attended to do two items of business: elect two council members and approve our 2021 spending plan. Carol Youngman was elected to the one-year council position to complete Lorraine Lundquist's term and Christine Garcia was elected to the three-year position replacing Melissa Pool. We owe Melissa and Lorraine a big thank you for serving on council and welcome Carol and Christine to the council. The 2021 spending plan was also approved which was mailed out to each of you at the beginning of the month. As is typical, it is a deficit budget and every year I have been a member we have always come through each year meeting all our obligations. I am looking forward to great things for OSLC in 2021.

Happy New Year! OSCC was touched by COVID in December. One of our staff members tested positive just before we were set to close for the Christmas holiday. After much discussion and talks with the health department, we decided to close a few days earlier than planned. All families were advised of the information we had been given. The teachers sanitized and cleaned classrooms. Sylvia was notified so that the janitorial crew could sanitize as well. Several of the staff members tested and were all negative! It was definitely not the way we had hoped to end the year, but thankfully everyone is healthy.

Our Christmas program went off without a hitch! It was great to be able to see the children singing together. We held our program outside and it was AMAZING! It may be something we look at continuing to do in the future. This month, we are expecting a few re-enrollments of children that haven't been back since we shut down in March. We are looking forward to seeing faces we have missed for so long. Our enrollment is still down from what it normally is, but it is slowly creeping up. We still have no babies (and we miss them greatly) and our toddler room is only half full, but the preschool side is growing slowly.
