

From the Pastor

Christ is alive! So, why aren't we? "This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." Psalm 118:24

Claire Cloninger writes: "I used to be a little baffled by Nehemiah 8:10:'For the joy of the Lord is your strength.' To me, that verse never made much sense, because joy didn't seem to be all that strong a quality. I thought it would have made more sense if it had said, 'The strength of the Lord is your joy.' But the longer I live, the more I realize that the ability to find joy in life really is a tremendous strength. The people who can laugh are the strong ones. The people who can throw their heads back and delight in the joy of the moment are going to live a lot longer than those of us who are stressed and pushed and taking ourselves terribly seriously."

What brings you joy? Most of us would say that being with family, whether it be spending time with our children, grandchildren, or great-grandchildren, and friends. Others may find joy in skiing, hiking, riding bikes, hunting, gardening, playing sports, bowling, playing cards, riding horses, walking on the beach, baking and the list could go on and on. If we find joy in these activities why don't some people find joy in worship or participating in the life of the church? We are called "to follow" Jesus, to be disciples of Jesus in this world every day, so why is it hard for us to do this? Some would say it is because "I don't know how to share my faith," "I don't feel that people accept me for who I am," "I have tried to do things in the church, but someone always complains about how I do them," or "People at church say one thing in the church building and another outside of the church," "I don't like what is going on, so I am not going to come," or "society doesn't accept me when I talk about Jesus and I don't like to be different from everyone else." How many times have you heard these types of excuses or something similar? I am sure you can come up with other excuses of why individuals do not share their faith or participate in the life of the church, but what is yours?

Sunday is the day when we gather as the community of believers to hear and participate in the Word and Sacrament so that we can be refreshed and renewed for mission in our daily life and in the world. Right now, we are refreshed in God's word virtually. Yes, I know it is not the same. We can do our part by sharing the church website, YouTube, and Facebook page with friends and family, so that all may know Christ in their lives. Sharing social media sites, letting others know that we have them, and talking to others about Christ is part of the leaving legacy for those in the future.

Christ is alive in our lives every day, not just during the Easter season, so why are we not rejoicing in the good news that Jesus has risen from the tomb and death has no sting? God created this day and every day of our lives, so let us rejoice and be glad in what we have been given and boldly share the good news of the Risen Christ with the world! We are very blessed with our musicians. We are now planning to start in-person church services on Sunday, May 23, the Day of Pentecost. There are many things to be worked out which are in process. Keep watching Pastor's weekly "News & Notes" emails which will have the details for the service.

Your church council is continuing to work a written COVID-19 Prevention Program (CPP) pursuant to an Emergency Temporary Standard in place for COVID-19, California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 8, section 3205(c). As I shared last month, Cal/OSHA is requiring every business/church with more than one employee to put a plan in place. This plan will detail all the COVID safety requirements which will include all the requirements for in-person worship. We are targeting approval of the plan at our council meeting in May before we begin in-person church services.

The gathering on Saturday, April 17, saw about 11 people participating. It is always great to get together and share. The next gathering is set for Saturday, May 15, from 5:30 to 7PM. It would be great if you can make it, but only come if you feel comfortable doing so.


